I. CALL TO ORDER

III. HEARINGS

Ronnie Shepperd – 147 North Lake Shore, looking for waiver to keep his boat parked on the grass. Storing the boat in the driveway will impede his elderly mother's activities. He does not wish to lay down gravel.

Joseph Brook – 51 Mountainview, is requesting a waiver on fines; explains that he took over his estate for a relative and did not receive notices as they were being sent to incorrect address. Tree debris is still present and expects to remove it by EOY. Patricia Spitzfaden – 5 Longview Dr., has tires in her ROW that she is unable to move herself. * volunteer in community will move them for her.

Bruce Alexander – 36 North Lake Shore, questions why in the 30 years he has lived here he has stored his boat on the grass. Questions why, in a boating community, storage of boats is becoming restricted. He does not wish to invest in the cost of hardtop or gravel for storing his boat on a trailer away from the road.

Joel Lukasik – 58 North Lake Shore, questions a parking letter he received. States that he agrees with others that parking should be allowed on grass. Questions if the ordinance was voted on.  - Liz explains that everything that is being sold will be a Blue Book value or best offer regardless of who is purchasing it.

 - * Board is concerned they will not get full asking price through auction.
 - All monies will be distributed to the account for which the equipment was used.

- d. Water Main Replacement: Re-interview vendors since there is a new board. Will be invited to next meeting.
 - Jon states we must pick an engineer now for spring, so we must act quickly. This is for the full length of North Lake Shore.
 - Ken states that the district will have to borrow money to complete job unless we can get a state subsidization.
- e. Water Meters: Brigid used water meter for trial run, as did two others. Stated all went smoothly. Would like to see software side. Request for an installation start date. Analog is set up outside and is manually read. Once again, may be an extra cost. Old meters must be read prior to installation of new meters. Some installations might be later due to seasonal homes.
- f. Reconstruction of pit area: Area has been cleaned up for the water operator. The total for repairing the area, installing blocks and creating retaining wall is \$5107.50. There was a cost previously paid to CT fence for initial clean up.

Jon motions to accept proposal for pit clean up and re-organization at the cost of \$5107.50.
